The ETSB is an advisory board to the Hillsdale County Board of Commissioners.

<u>Budget information</u>: In 2008 expenses total approximately \$850,000. Almost \$640,000 of this went to pay salaries and benefits for the 12 full and part-time dispatchers and supervisors plus the director and assistant. The additional \$210,000 paid for maintenance and repairs on radio and computer equipment, office and tower rental, utilities, and other normal expenses.
